Alice Cooper, and Odetta

1990 — founded The Brautigan Library – a library
devoted exclusively to unpublished books

1991-1998 — owned a computer software business and created two
applications for the Macintosh computer

1999-2005 — art broker, representing two Italian automotive model builders

2006 — began writing first novel

2007 — resumed shooting serious portraits, after a thirty-year hiatus

2008 — first solo portrait exhibition at Shelburne Farms, Shelburne, VT

2009 — solo exhibitions at the Flynn Center for the Arts, Burlington, VT and Lake
Placid Center for the Arts, Lake Placid, NY

2011 — released debut novel, *Dance of the Innocents*
